Biography: Anthony (Tony) Day took up his current post of Professor of Biochemistry within the Wellcome Trust Centre for Cell-Matrix Research at the University of Manchester in October 2005. Before this, he spent ~25 years at the University of Oxford. It was here that he did his first degree in Chemistry at Exeter College (1981-1985), which was followed by a DPhil (with Robert Sim) at Wolfson College (1988). Between 1988-1998 Tony was a research fellow within the Department of Biochemistry, University of Oxford, including holding an Arthritis Research UK Research Fellowship from 1991-1998. In 1998 he became a member of MRC Senior Scientific Staff within the MRC's Immunochemistry Unit (Oxford). He is a member of several scientific societies (including the British Society for Matrix Biology) and is a founding member of the International Society for Hyaluronan Sciences. Tony's research focuses on protein-glycosaminoglycan interactions in the context of inflammation and
